Pursuant to ARS 15-2002(C)(9) the SFB held a public hearing to hear comment on the construction of schools near the Luke Air Force Base. Bob Young and Scott Thompson of the Dysart Unified School District explained that the Luke Air Force Base has already granted their approval to the construction of these two schools.

John Wright asked what factors the Air Force evaluates before they approve a site.

Mr. Young stated that they look at the location and the potential accident zones. The Air Force already has mapped out the accident zones and current and future flight paths. He added that the District works with the Air Force before they even request a site from the SFB.

Pat Conley asked what level of the accident potential zone do these schools fall in. Mr. Young stated that this would be below moderate, it is less than what some of the existing schools fall under.

Mr. Thompson added that the Air Force Base also wants children to be dispersed throughout the area, as they do not want a high concentration of children in one area.

Ms. Conley asked if there have been any problems with students because of noise. Mr. Thompson stated that the district has not done any studies on the impact of noise, but there have not been any complaints from parents or teachers.

John Wright asked if the Air Force has a school on Base. Scott Thompson stated that one of Dysart's schools, Luke Elementary, is next to the base, but there is not one actually on base. Mr. Wright stated that while Luke Elementary is even closer to the base, it has been deemed safe, so this site should be sufficient as well.
